

### General Information

Ottawa Valley Land Rovers is the oldest and largest Land Rover club in Canada and the second oldest in North America. Membership is open to all Land Rover enthusiasts. Executive meetings are held on the first Monday of every month. Social meetings are held on the third Monday of every month, generally at the Prescott Hotel on Preston Street.

OVLR offers a monthly newsletter and a variety of activities throughout the year, from mechanical seminars and off-road rallies to social events and family oriented outings. Members receive discounts on parts from a number of North American suppliers. Offroad activities come in several categories. The light version, which is usually entertainment during a rally or at one of our family summer events, consists of a little "mud bogging" or tours along country lanes. The heavy stuff, which is usually several days across public lands navigating by compass, topographical maps and aerial photos, involves bridge building, river barging, and driving conditions raging from cedar swamp to rocky hill winching.

Membership: Canadians joining throughout the year pay \$50 CDN per year, Americans and others pay \$50 US per year (discounts available if you receive the newsletter by email). Membership is valid for one year.


Happy New Year to everyone and all your families and friends. Your executive committee is actively planning another great year of events to use your Land Rover as the Wilkes brothers intended.



## Repairing a Td5 non starter

When I purchased my new (to me) 2000 model year Defender 110 I picked it up at the autoport in Halifax and drove it home to Ottawa. I was lucky to have relatives to visit in New Brunswick and stayed overnight.

At the end of the first day of highway driving I stopped for some food and fuel and the 110 refused to start. Uh oh! I thought crap, what's up now? I turned the key multiple times back and forth and suddenly vroom, she started. I figured from this point forward no shut off refuelling and park on a down hill for bump starts.

I got home with no further issues. A quick check on the Defender2.net forum revealed a very common age related Td5 starter failure issue. The contacts wear out at around 100K or so and my new purchase had 118K.

I ordered a solenoid rebuild kit off fleabay for about \$25 delivered and removed the starter. The job is very simple and quick to do so if you have a Td5 this is a worthwhile maintenance procedure. The only really fiddly part is that the top nut securing the upper parts of the starter to the bell housing is tucked under the intake, fuel heater and a bunch of fuel

lines and such. The rebuild kit comes with pictures and instructions but not how to get the starter out.

You'll need a couple or three ratchet extensions to get it just right and you can turn the ratchet about a quarter turn at a time. Once loose, it spins off easily (well, at least mine did).
