

LAND ROVER SAFE

For now, at least, Land Rover Ltd. has been removed from the auction block. The hue and cry from the news that Land Rover might be owned by a U.S. firm was at least partially responsible for this. In England, a nationwide "Keep Land Rover British" campaign served to rally support among the people.

Overlander magazine and the Association of Rover Clubs Ltd. (of which the LROA is a member) teamed up with Kelvin van Hassalt of Edward Arnold Publishers to focus world attention on the situation. In the end, the British Government removed Land Rover from the proposed deal. Who says public opinion doesn't count!







FIRE ENGINES IN THE CALGARY AREA

Last summer on a tip by local buff Bob Stelmack I went to investigate a fire truck on a farm just west of Calgary. For years I had heard rumors of a fire truck at the Gulf Oil Refinery in Calgary and incredibly, despite my reputation as a diehard enthusiast, I had never investigated this lead.


Jim Gallup along with his wife Lena drove myself and my wife Inge out to investigate on a summer evening in August. The accompanying photos were taken at this time. The vehicle is a 1960 109" pickup with "Firefly" body by Fire Armour Limited.... 9 George Street London W 1. Serial no. is 154002928 with 4978 miles on the odometer. Equipment includes 90 amp alternator in place of the original underhood item (which may have been delivered thus or modified by Gulf), 2 large searchlights - centre P.T.O. pump - oil cooler - front capstan winch (at present disconnected) - 2 wheeled foam trailer (which was originally supplied with L/R as complete unit) and a full complement of hoses, ladders, etc.

The trailer features Land Rover wheels and I believe follows in the same track as the L/R although I cannot verify this as it was parked a fair distance away and I never thought to measure at the time. (Nor in subsequent visits!)

I expressed some interest in purchase as I knew the vehicle was for sale and was informed the price was \$5,000.00 (Can you imagine a better advertisement for a firm specializing in L/R parts?!) A few months later the price had risen to \$8,000.00! One would assume that any buyer would wish to own this vehicle to lovingly restore and cherish rather than a profit-making venture and, as I know what the owner paid for it, I consider the price outrageous.

Quite interestingly the black-out on the doors covers "British-American Oil Co.", which as you old-timers (over 40) know was the predecessor of Gulf Oil. The vehicle is original and complete but requires a thorough loving restoration. I would be pleased to supply the name and address of the owner as the price is far beyond the means of our firm. *

The second vehicle I enjoyed even more. The story starts when I noticed in the local buy and sell paper in October an ad for some L/R shop manuals for sale. I telephoned and agreed to purchase said manuals, when in the course of the conversation, I learned that the seller had sold his own L/R some time ago and was now disposing of these items, but was employed by the Alberta Government at a Ranger Station that had in use a Land Rover fire truck! If you are bothering to read this I can imagine your reaction was similar to mine!! The next morning I drove my partner Philip's L/R out to the Elbow Ranger Station which is approximately 45 minutes southwest of Calgary. The gentleman, Ken MacKay, was extremely co-operative in taking me to the garage and moving the machine out to allow my photography and inspection.



Particulars: The vehicle is owned by the Government of Alberta, Recreation and Parks Department. It is based at the Elbow Ranger Station and used for forest fire suppression. (The Alberta Forest Service is responsible for fighting forest fires but within the confines of campgrounds this machine (Recreation and Parks) would take initial action. It is a 1963 88", (serial no. 24405372A) pickup with a "Carmichael" fire appliance. Features are a 200 gallon centre-mounted water tank and rearmounted centre P.T.O. pump. The vehicle has a genuine 3000 miles on it and apart from a missing front lens (supplied gratis by Campart Calgary by the time you read this) and a slightly damaged left front fender is absolutely mint!! No rust, no wear and tear, no restoration required - vehicle is absolutely as new! What a joy to behold!

^{*}Footnote: We were out last weekend, vehicle and trailer have been moved to indoor storage - inspection is welcomed by prospective buyers.

Three employees only are allowed to operate this machine, which likely explains why, despite being a "company vehicle", it is in such pristine condition.

While enjoying both machines immensely I have a bias to the 88" not because it is in better condition than the 109" (which it most definitely is) but because the 109" is owned by a fellow with no particular interest in Land Rovers (perhaps a bit mercenary with the great price hike) and the 88" is a working machine. Why replace it, and with what, and at what cost? The 109" can easily be purchased and owned if you have the money, but the 88" can't until it comes up for bid at a government auction. I am sure we would all like to own it and yet I find it profoundly satisfying that such a genuine machine is still doing an honest days work and likely to be doing so for some time to come...

If any readers find themselves in Calgary, call me at the shop and I will be quite pleased to offer precise directions to these vehicles. A most pleasant scenic drive to Elbow Falls, goes right by the door, so to speak, of both machine's locations, Elbow Falls and the ice caves, offering great hiking and picnicing opportunities are within 15 minutes of the Ranger Sation on a first class, all-weather gravel road. Bring your family, wife, girlfriend and camera!

(Note from Editor: It would be wise leave either your wife or your girlfriend at home at any particular time. Sorry Mike couldn't resist!)





TECH TIPS-by the numbers

WEBER CARB DATA

In June 1985 I installed a 2-barrel Weber carburetor, purchased as a kit from West Coast British, on my 1969 Series IIA 88. The new carburetor has produced increased power and improved highway gas mileage over the Rochester with which I replaced the original Zenith. I never kept detailed mileage records for the Rochester or the Zenith but typically I would get 11-12 mpg in the city with each. The Zenith would, at best, get 14 mpg on highway and the Rochester about 15 (under ideal conditions it could give 16-1/mpg). Since installing the Weber, I have driven over 2000 miles and have kept detailed records of gas consumption. The table below summerizes my records.

As you can see, city mpg is not much improved but there is a significant improvement in highway mpg and power. My LR is equipped with Warn tree-wheeling hubs and a Fairey overdrive. In top gear, in OD, with 30 inch tires, I turn 2700 rpm at 55 mph. I use leaded premium tuel.





Land Rover sale is shelved for two years

LAND ROVER will not be sold off for two years.

And the future of the firm's £90,000-a-year joint chief executive. Mr David Andrews, who led a management-employee buy-out bid, is now in question.

News of the temporary Uturn was revealed last night by Trade and Industry Secretary Paul Channon, who told

A British Leyland statement said it had recommended that the Land Rover group, including Range Rover and Freight Rover, 'be retained to continue their preparation for privatisation—and the Government had accepted this.'


The decision came as a disappoinment to Mr Andrews, whose joint chief executive Ray Horrocks, in charge of Austin Rover cars and Unipart, has clearly voted against his buy-out bid.

Mr Horrocks favoured a sellout to America's General Motors, who withdrew their offer to buy the whole of BL's commercial vehicles after the Government, under public pressure refused to include the Land Rover side.

His £90,000 job, too, could now be in doubt.






