APRIL OVLR MEETING

It was Italian fare for eight at the April 1 club meeting when Treas Johnson announced a bank balance for the month of \$454.06 with 40 members paid. DUES: April 1 marked the deadline for 1985 dues for current members and reluctantly we had to drop three members from club rolls. The three are no longer eligible for club discounts, activities or the newsletter. The decision to drop them from the club was not an easy one. However, on a motion from the floor, it was pointed out that the \$5 annual fee was due at the January 30 annual meeting. Members had been reminded and warned of the cutoff in two subsequent newsletters and had received a personal phone call one week before the deadline. INITIATION FEE: In related business, the club voted to instigate a one-time initiation fee for new members in an effort to keep the newsletter paying for itself without a sharp increase in dues. We have been hit with a hefty increase in newsletter production costs and expect another hike when the post office raises its rates. The \$10 initiation fee, in addition to the annual \$5 dues, applies to anyone not listed as a member April 1, 1985. PARTS POOL: Club plans for a central listing of LR parts held by members have been shelved for the time being. The plan was to provide a single source of who had what parts for sale or loan whereby members would have an alternative to paying big bucks for new parts or buying from strangers when the piece they needed was lying in a fellow member's basement. Key to the plan was members sending a list of their parts to the club. However, after six months of effort, insufficient information was collected from members to make the project worthwhile. CLUB PARTS: Still dealing with parts, all bits and pieces owned by the club will be sold for 15% of the latest ABP price or OVLR acquisition cost plus 15%. The payment policy also applies to items loaned for experiment or emergencies with the money being refunded upon return of the item to club stocks. The move was needed to avoid misunderstandings regarding payment and to help keep track of stocks.
