LAND ROVER CANADA PRESS RELEASE... An updated version of the original Land Rover, now powered by an aluminum V-8 engine, will be available in Canada beginning November 1. With a base price targeted at less than \$35,000, the 1994 Defender 90 is the most affordable product available in Canada.

Based on the continually refined "Ninety" model that has served in other world markets since 1983, the Defender 90 is the only V-8 powered sport utility of its kind available in Canada. It is also the first Defender 90 with standard four-wheel disc brakes. "The Defender 90 is one of the most capable off-road vehicles on the market today" said Alan Manessy, Managing Director Land Rover Canada Inc. "You might call it a substitute for the 'sports car' in the 90's, but with the freedom and utility of a four-wheel drive vehicle that has few boundaries." The vehicle, an encore to last year's highly successful limited edition Defender 110, will be produced in low volumes and in just one trim level to allow each vehicle to be outfitted to owner specification.

"The plan is to provide buyers a highly versatile basic platform with all the traditional Land Rover capability built in. In effect, the buyer starts with an 'open to the air' platform, then customizes the Defender 90 to his or her own needs using factory approved accessories," said Mansessy.

Defender 90 has several flexible top configurations to suit all weather conditions and the driver's mood. Among these are a Tickford-developed cloth convertible top to keep out undesirable elements, a "Bimini" half-top for outings where protection from the sun is critical but open-air breezes are desired, or a fully open position with no top fitted and the door windows removed for true open-air motoring. The vehicle is fitted from the factory with a full tonneau cover to protect the interior. Besides the top options, buyers will be able to choose from a list of Land Rover-approved, dealer-installed accessories including air conditioning, side runners, a forward-facing two-person rear seat, full carpeting, lamp guards, a choice of two

distinctive bush bars, an innovative roof rack system and an 8000 lb. Warn winch. Auxiliary lighting for off-pavement use is also available. Five-spoke "Freestyle choice" alloy wheels will be a factory option. The same proven 3.9 litre, 182 horsepower, fuel-injected engine with 232 lbs/ft. of torque used in the Range Rover Country gives Defender 90 more than ample reserves of power for any situation and with a curb weight of under 1618 kg, a horsepower-to-weight ratio comparable to many sports cars.

Defender 90 is available in five colours: Aries Blue, Conistone Green, AA Yellow, Portifino Red and Alpine White. Standard Equipment includes reclining bucket seats with twill-effect upholstery, an AM/FM stereo cassette entertainment system with four weather resistant speakers and a lockable security cover, centre cubby box, 265/75 X 16, BF Goodrich Mud Terrain tires on uniquely styled steel wheels, and a rear mounted swing away rear tire.



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
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
