General Information

Ottawa Valley Land Rovers is the oldest and largest Land Rover club in Canada. Membership is open to all Land Rover enthusiasts. Executive meetings are held on the first Monday of every month. Social meetings are held on the third Monday of every month, generally at the Prescott Hotel on Preston Street.

OVLR offers a monthly newsletter and a variety of activities throughout the year, from mechanical seminars and off-road rallies to social events and family oriented outings. Members receive discounts on parts from a number of North American suppliers. Off-road activities come in several categories. The light version, which is usually entertainment during a rally or at one of our family summer events, consists of a little "mud bogging" or tours along country lanes. The heavy stuff, which is usually several days across public lands navigating by compass, topographical maps and aerial photos, involves bridge building, river barging, and driving conditions ranging from cedar swamp to rocky hill winching.

Membership: Canadians joining throughout the year pay \$45 CDN per year, Americans and others pay \$45 US per year (discounts available if you receive newsletter by email). Membership is valid for one year.


2009 Oiler and Swap Meet

Franktown Exploration



Here are a few photos from an unmaintained road I investigated just east of Franktown. Turn south off Hwy #10 onto Davis Side Road, then west onto Whipoorwill Road – after a short distance it becomes the unmaintained road.

The first 2/3 of the road is an easy drive. It traverses a marshy area but there was just a small amount of water flowing over the road. Even if there was more water – possibly in the spring – it would likely still be easy as there is a rocky surface to the road at this location.


